



Process and Schedule

ITD has been working for many years to improve I-84 in Canyon County.




ITD began a traffic study and environmental evaluation of I-84 between Caldwell and the Karcher Interchange.



ITD completed environmental work between the Centennial Way and Karcher interchanges.

- Final design and construction began shortly afterward between Franklin Road and Karcher Road.
- Due to funding limitations, ITD paused work from Centennial Way to Franklin Road.



Through Governor Little's Leading Idaho program, the Idaho Transportation Board voted to begin design for I-84 between the Centennial Way and Franklin Road interchanges.

2023

Construction is expected to begin between the Centennial Way and Franklin interchanges.

This process has included numerous public meetings and outreach. ITD thanks everyone who has given comments along the way.







Leading Idaho TECM Program

To address the state's rapid growth, the Idaho Legislature passed a historic transportation revenue package that Governor Little signed as part of his "Leading Idaho" initiative in May 2021.

The Legislation transfers \$80 million dollars a year in the Idaho **Transportation Department's Transportation Expansion and Congestion Mitigation** (TECM) fund. Leveraging these TECM funds as debt service on bonds could yield as much as \$1.2-1.5 billion in improvements.

Projects in TECM corridors will accelerate the construction of critical transportation improvements that would otherwise take many years to build, reduce congestion, improve safety and modernize aging roads and bridges across Idaho.





1-84 Mainline Typical Section











Operations and Mobility

Improvements will keep travel speeds above 55 mph during peak hours.






Centennial Way Interchange

The westbound Centennial Way Interchange off-ramp will be modified to accommodate the improvements to I-84. Improvements include:

- Two exit lanes from I-84; one exit only lane and one exit/through lane.
- A second left-turn only lane onto Centennial Way (SH-19).
- A signal at the intersection of Centennial Way and the off-ramp.
- A pedestrian crossing on the north side of the signalized intersection.



10th Avenue Interchange

- The existing I-84 bridge over 10th Avenue was built in 1983 and will be reconstructed to accommodate additional lanes on I-84.
- The loop ramp will be modified to be the only westbound on-ramp to I-84. The second westbound on-ramp will be removed.
- > 10th Avenue will continue to have five lanes with sidewalks and bike lanes on each side.









Soundwall








Pedestrian Overpass Rehabilitation

ITD will rehabilitate the pedestrian overpass on I-84 east of 10th Avenue. This work includes:

- Repainting the overpass.
- Installing new lighting.
- Replacing fencing.
- Updating both entrances to the overpass.





FRANKLIN ROAD EXIT 29




Construction Overview

Construction will begin in Summer 2023 and continue until early 2026.


DURING CONSTRUCTION, YOU CAN EXPECT:

- > Two lanes of I-84 will be open in both directions during the day.
- Overnight closures or lane restrictions will be necessary.
- Construction will require extended detours at the Centennial Way and 10th Avenue interchanges (exits 27 and 28).
- Access to local businesses will be open, but your route may change.
- More specific information will be available once ITD begins working with a contractor next summer.



Construction: Ramp Closures

This project will require extended closures and detours at the Centennial Way and 10th Avenue Interchanges. These closures are necessary to protect drivers and construction workers in a tight work zone.




Proposed Detour Routes



Construction: Pedestrian detours

During construction, the pedestrian overpass will be closed approximately one year. Two six-month closures will occur during two stages of construction.
