- Tubesheet faces in good condition.
- Tubesheet stays and associated welds in good condition.
- Tube ends and tube seal welds in good condition: No deterioration.
- Tube ID's covered with typical ash deposits: no corrosion.
- Tube OD's have tightly ground pitting to .003".
- All castable refractory at the burner and return ends is in good condition

Visual Internal

- SD Check to ensure the nameplate is legible and attached to the Boiler
- SD Inspect stairways, platforms, ladders and walkways
- SD Check for evidence of leaks on flanges, welds, relief valves, heads, headers, tubes, etc.
- SD Check for corrosion around heads of nuts, bolts and bracket connections
- SD Examine external condition of Boiler and its' support structure. Note condition of external coating or paint
- SD Inspect structural steel supports for corrosion, distortion and cracking
- SD The area of contact between any anchor bolts and any concrete and steel should be scraped and closely examined for corrosion
- SD Check the static ground wire to ensure it is property attached
- SD Auxiliary equipment such as gauges are inspected for damage
- SD Verify that the external UT survey TML'S are in the appropriate places
- SD Check associated PSVs for set pressure, capacity, servicing date and correct installation
- SD Inspect the foundation and supports for settling, spalling and cracking
- SD Ensure the anchor bolts on the sliding saddle are loose and allow the Boiler to move
