Parts Used:	-unit failed first loadbanking attempt due to getting close to overtemp shutdown, had rad cleaned then tried again still to much heat so changed thermostats/seals: passed loadbank no problem
Comments:	<ul> <li>-on top of CSA 282, Caterpillar Removal from storage procedure was followed prior to running the unit</li> <li>-small coolant seep @ coolant heater (need to replace coolant heater oring as its baked)</li> <li>-lots of signs of mice ontop of engine and throughout unit (everywhere but behind gen controller), however no wire insulation damage noted</li> <li>-electric lube pump wires not landed (could/should be set up to prelube/post lube)</li> <li>-fuel pressire gauge @ secondary fuel filter needle is broken inside/needs replacement</li> <li>-small oil or fuel leak @ right side bank where exhaust meets turbodissappeared after loadbanking: likely from low load running</li> <li>-March 9-10 Layed Up unit as per CAT C27 Layup procedure. Also recommend changing coolant and filling to top of top rad tank</li> </ul>
