#### 1.0 GENERAL SCOPE SUMMARY

This specification covers the design, supply, fabrication and assembly of two (2 x 100%) complete Propane Booster Pumps W06-P-9230A/B with electric driver motors W06-PM-9230A/B, for installation at the Cenovus Foster Creek W06-Pad.

The above mechanical equipment to come complete with baseplate, magnetic drive system, couplings and guards, etc.

#### 2.0 CODES AND STANDARDS

Minimum requirements shall be in accordance with applicable codes and governmental requirements. Specifically:

#### 4.0 TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

#### 4.1 General Requirements

- 4.1.1 The work shall include, but not be limited to, the engineering/design, manufacturing, assembly, shop fabrication, supply of materials, labour, equipment, skid mounting of the pumps, auxiliaries, quality assurance, functionality and performance testing, inspection, certification, supply operation and maintenance manuals, and consumables that are required to deliver the equipment as defined in the specifications, technical notes, datasheets and drawings.
- 4.1.2 The Vendor shall read, understand and follow all applicable documents listed in the attached "List of Technical Documents". All questions relating to this document, technical drawings and any of Cenovus' specifications shall be posed, in writing, directly to the purchaser.
- 4.1.3 In the event of a perceived conflict within these Technical Specifications, or between these Technical Specifications and other applicable Codes, Standards, and Regulations, Vendor shall contact Purchaser for a ruling in writing prior to fabrication.

- 4.1.4 All work not expressly called for in this requisition, but necessary for the complete and proper installation, maintenance and operation of the equipment, shall be supplied by the Vendor at no additional charge.
- 4.1.5 Vendor shall size, and provide warranty for, rated performance of all datasheet specified conditions. Vendor shall state the design pressure of all pieces of equipment, and the maximum allowable operating pressure of the pump.
- 4.1.6 Work shall meet, or exceed, all applicable Cenovus specifications.

#### 4.2 Mechanical Requirements

- 4.2.1 Pumps and motors shall be suitable for outdoor use.
- 4.2.2 Pump shall be furnished complete with pump, driver, coupling and guard, all required auxiliaries, pipe and tubing. For end suction pump all equipment shall be mounted on a base plate.
- 4.2.3 Vendor to provide a detail drawing of the base plate and the mounting requirements as TSE will be designing a skid this pump (with its baseplate) will be mounted on.
- 4.2.4 Vendor to provide the stiffness requirements to install the pump (with its baseplate) on steel beams, on piles.
- 4.2.5 Vendor to provide baseplate levelness requirements and TSE supplied baseplate levelness requirements.
- 4.2.6 A bill of material shall be submitted.
- 4.2.7 All instrument and piping components such as valves, fittings etc (if applicable) shall be c/w CRN. Suction and discharge piping will be done by others.
- 4.2.8 Non-sparking type coupling guards shall be provided.
- 4.2.9 Motors and electrical equipment shall be IEEE and CSA approved and labeled.
- 4.2.10 Motors shall have an enclosure suitable for Class I, Zone 2, Group IIA, T1 Hazardous Area.
- 4.2.11 Motor shall be sized so it is not overloaded at any point on the pump curve with the supplied impeller size, not accounting for the service factor.
- 4.2.12 The exterior components of pumps, accessories, and electric motor drivers shall have 'No Exposed Yellow Metals'
- 4.2.13 Sound level shall not exceed 85 dBA at 1.0 m from the source. See Cenovus specification TR-50-SPC-00-005-01.

- 4.2.14 Pump and motor shall have a standard stainless steel nameplates securely affixed in a conspicuous place, showing the name and address of the Manufacturer, serial and model number, item number, service, purchase order number, year built, weight, capacity, differential head, speed in rpm, maximum allowable working pressure and temperature, hydrostatic test pressure and such other information as the vendor may consider necessary to complete the identification of the item.
- 4.2.15 Vendor shall complete pump data sheet.
- 4.2.16 Vendor to provide the allowable nozzle loads.

#### 4.3 Inspection and Testing

- 4.3.1 An inspection will be carried out by the TSE/Cenovus representative per the enclosed Inspection Requirements document with this requisition and Vendor's ITP, approved by Buyer.
- 4.3.2 Vendor will arrange for an Inspection in accordance with applicable jurisdictions and Alberta government regulations, and a certificate to this effect will be provided by the Vendor.
- 4.3.3 Hydrotesting of pumps casings, piping, tubing etc. will be performed in accordance with current code requirements.
- 4.3.4 Components that are fabricated by welding shall be stress relieved, if required, so that both the welds and the heat affected zones meet the yield strength and hardness requirements.

#### 4.4 Start-up and commissioning

- 4.4.1 Vendor may be required to supply commissioning services and shall provide rates for the same.
- 4.4.2 Vendor to provide the pump cold start-up procedures if there are any special cold start-up considerations required

#### 4.5 Spare Parts

4.5.1 Vendor shall supply a list of all recommended spare parts and their prices for start-up/commissioning and 2 year of operation and any other spare parts deemed critical.

#### 4.6 Shipping

- 4.6.1 Vendor shall prepare the equipment for shipping as per Cenovus spec TR-50-SPC-00-003-01 "Shop Preparation of Equipment for Shipment & Storage". Shipping is by others.
- 4.6.2 Vendor to make sure that the pump is properly drained and prepared for outdoor storage before shipment, as it likely will not be able to be stored indoors.
- 4.6.3 Equipment shall be adequately prepared to provide against entry of dirt or water during shipment. All flanged openings must be provided with substantial wooden or gasketed metal

closure securely fastened with bolts or clamps. All drains, vents and small piping connections shall be capped or plugged.

- 4.6.4 Instruments, drain valves, pipe and other components may be shipped loose to help prevent shipping damage or due to shipping constraints. Crate and clearly tag all loose components.
- 4.6.5 One complete set of printed Installation, Operation and Maintenance instructions shall be packaged with the crates.

#### 4.7 Guarantee

4.7.1 Provide a process guarantee that the equipment will meet the processing requirements stated. In addition, provide a material and workmanship guarantee for a minimum of 12 months from startup, but no longer than 18 months from delivery.

#### 2.0 Scope

- 2.1 When material and/or equipment (goods) covered by this Purchase Order are subject to shop inspections by the Buyer, DO NOT SHIP prior to release by the Buyer's Inspection Representative.
- 2.2 The Buyer's Inspection Representative shall have the right to witness tests and inspect the goods at Seller's plant(s) or Seller's sub-suppliers plant at any time during manufacture. Seller or Seller's Sub-suppliers shall provide access to, and copies of Quality Assurance Manuals, plans and records, controlled copies, if so requested.
- 2.3 The Seller shall include in any Order to a sub-supplier those specifications included with this Purchase Order, which governs the manufacturing or testing of the goods produced by each sub-supplier.
- 2.4 When in the Buyer's opinion an initial inspection visit will be beneficial in achieving a quality product, it will be indicated on the quality surveillance plan and, in such cases, fabrication is not to commence until this meeting is held. Seller's management personnel who are responsible for the quality requirements shall participate in the initial quality surveillance.
- 2.5 The Seller shall furnish the Buyer's Inspection Representative with unpriced copies of their Purchase Orders for plates, forgings, pressure containing parts and fabricated sub-assemblies during the first quality surveillance visit.
- 2.6 The Buyer's Inspection Representative, upon sufficient notice to Seller, shall be allowed access to Seller's sub-suppliers' quality control and quality verification records in order to review compliance to the specifications and applicable codes and/or standards.
- 2.7 Seller shall provide an Inspection and Test Plan detailing processes involved in the supply and manufacture of the equipment including methods of and procedures for verification. This shall include all major Sub Vendors. Each (ITP) shall include, as a minimum, all manufacturing functions, a list of specifications to be met, a description of tests to ensure compliance and identify who will perform verification of tests.
- 2.8 The Buyer shall have the right to conduct and carry out external audits for compliance with the approved Quality Program or Quality Plan.
- 2.9 Seller shall provide a safe working environment for Buyer's representative(s) and shall alert Buyer's representative to all known potential hazards.
- 2.10 Seller shall assure that the quality of the equipment/materials provided directly or indirectly are in complete accordance with the Purchase Order and its referenced specifications and all attachments and amendments thereto are met.

#### 3.0 Responsibility

- 3.1 The responsibility to properly manufacture and thoroughly inspect the material and/or equipment rests solely with the Seller. This responsibility shall include material and/or equipment received from or fabricated by the Seller's sub-suppliers.

#### 4.2 Witness Points (Observations or Verification Points)

Verification points are defined as critical steps in manufacturing and testing where witnessing or verification to confirm compliance with the quality requirements is considered necessary. The Seller is obligated to advise the Buyer's Inspection Representative of witness point dates in advance. The Seller may proceed past a verification point providing permission to proceed is requested and obtained in writing from the Buyer's Inspection Representative.

#### 4.3 Hold Points

Hold points are defined as critical steps in the manufacturing or testing where witnessing by the Buyer's Inspection Representative is mandatory. Fabrication or testing must not proceed past a hold point. The Seller is obligated to advise the Buyer's Inspection Representative of hold point dates in advance and in sufficient time to permit Buyer's Inspection Representative to attend on the required hold point date.

#### 4.4 Inspection Levels

The Inspection Levels (page 3) reflect the minimum surveillance activities but in no way limits the activities that may be attended by the Buyer's Inspection Representative. The final witness and hold points will be established during the initial inspection.

To assist the Seller in understanding the Buyer's inspection level system, the following brief definitions are offered. The Buyer retains the right to change the level during the duration of the fabrication cycle.

The Inspection Company will be appointed by the Owner and/or Owner's Representative, and the Vendor advised.

- Seller shall notify Buyer's Expediter, in writing, of any actual or anticipated delays immediately upon their discovery. Such notice will include estimated period of delay, cause of delay and corrective actions being taken by Seller.
- Seven (7) working days prior to shipment, Seller shall notify TSE expediting contact to confirm/obtain final routing, carrier and destination instructions.

#### PACKING / STORAGE / SHIPPING & MARKING INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1.0 GENERAL

- 1.1 Seller shall include but not be limited to the following guidelines for preservation, protection and packaging of materials and equipment. These guidelines are in place for the protection of the material and equipment from mechanical damage, freezing and atmospheric corrosion during transit, and to prevent damage due to rough handling and vibration.
- 1.2 It will be the responsibility of the Seller to provide Buyer's Agent with their standard Preservation Procedure as well as any Special Packaging and Storage Requirements to ensure full warranty protection as described in the Purchase Order.

#### 2.0 PACKAGING / STORAGE GUIDELINES

- 2.1 The packaging will be done in such a manner as to prevent damage due to rough handling, condensation corrosion and vibration. Should fungus protection be required such treatment will not be applied to electrical contacts or current carrying metal surfaces.
- 2.2 All items shall be clear of debris, dirt and foreign matter (thoroughly clean inside and out) prior to shipment preparation, and as a minimum, all items whether shipped in boxes or affixed to pallets shall be waterproof.
- 2.3 The Seller shall ensure that loose shipped items or accessories that are removed from the main equipment or equipment that require field assembly, are placed in separate packages or bundles according to the categories listed in Paragraph 2.13 and then labeled indicating the Purchase Order number, name of the main machine to which the accessory belongs, name of the accessory, accessory (part) number and position number on the assembly drawings. These items must be clearly indicated on a packing slip attached to the bill of lading.
  - 2.3.1 Any instrumentation or other small attachments, subject to damage due to vibration or jarring, must be removed, sleeved in polyethylene and sealed or packaged in waterproof vapour barrier packages and clearly marked as to location to be reinstalled. All resulting openings must be sealed.
  - 2.3.2 Special tools shall be separately packaged, shipped, identified as per loose shipped accessories and marked as "Special Tools".
  - 2.3.3 Recommended spare parts shall be separately marked as "Commissioning spares" or "Operating spares" as specified by the Buyer. The Seller will also clearly identify the item or items and the equipment component which they are intended for.
- 2.4 Packaged /prefabricated (skid mounted) equipment will be required to have all components properly blocked and braced for shipment. All temporary blocking and bracing will be painted red for clear identification for removal upon installation at site. If some of the components extend beyond the package base, a special approval will be required from Buyer's representative. When no approval is given, the components must be disassembled, packaged separately and resulting openings protected and sealed.
  - 2.4.1 Control panels that are not attached to the skid will be affixed to either pallet or runners and securely covered with polyethylene.
  - 2.4.2 All gauges that are deemed stable for transport will have their glass face taped in an "X" manner.
  - 2.4.3 All bolted connections shall be properly tightened as per mechanical requirements prior to shipment.

- 2.4.4 The Seller shall ensure that all hinged openings are securely located or banded closed to prevent possible opening during shipping.
- 2.4.5 Items with exposed rubber parts or linings shall be wrapped with an opaque, air tight plastic cover secured with tape. Desiccant shall not be used to protect rubber products.
- 2.5 Equipment shall be bolted to the package (pallet) base whenever possible. Equipment not bolted to the base shall be protected and held in a fixed position by banding, chock blocks, bracing and packing material.
- 2.6 Valves that are strapped to pallets or shipped in boxes shall have ends /openings sealed to prevent moisture or foreign matter from entering, and all valves will be in the closed position and the wheel or handle removed and marked as to correspond with the reinstallation.
- 2.7 The packaging shall be done in such a manner as to prevent damage due to condensation corrosion:
  - 2.7.1 Desiccant shall be required in all types of protection and packaging when condensation or vapour diffusion across vapour barriers would create a condition in the interior of the package harmful to the contents. Desiccant shall be fully contained in bags (to prevent dispersion), securely fixed in place and easily removed. The package shall indicate that desiccants shall be checked weekly and changed as necessary.
  - 2.7.2 Internal surfaces subject to rusting shall be protected by vapour phase inhibitors, rust preventatives or by a suitable desiccant. After treatment, all openings must be plugged or otherwise sealed.
  - 2.7.3 All items shall be clean before application of any anti-corrosive material. Machined and bright surfaces shall be coated with an anti-corrosive material.
  - 2.7.4 Components with non-drainage crevices or chambers shall be covered and protected at all times from entrance of water and debris.
  - 2.7.5 Pump and compressor interiors shall be coated or flushed with an easily removable anti-corrosive material. Lube oil and auxiliary piping shall be flushed with a corrosive preventative material that is soluble in the fluid to be carried by the piping.
  - 2.7.6 Rust inhibitors shall be compatible with the normal charge of oil or easily removed by flushing when used on lubricated parts. Oil recommended for normal operation or a compatible substitute shall be used when filling or flushing.
- In cases where the Seller is responsible to load equipment/materials as per the delivery /freight terms of the Purchase Order, the Seller shall ensure that items which are subject to damage by rubbing are separated by wooden strips. The Seller and Buyer's representative (when present) will ensure that padding is placed under chains that contact the materials. In all cases the Seller shall ensure that the transporter secures (chains down) the equipment at locations that will not cause undue stress and damage during transport (i.e. nozzles or flanged are not to be used).
- 2.9 When specified by Buyer, goods are to be tarped prior to transporter leaving Seller premises.
- 2.10 Sharp corners and small protuberances shall be protected against being knocked off during transport, loading and unloading.
- 2.11 Shipping saddles, cradles, bolsters, and chock blocks shall be contoured to the outside curvature of equipment and located so that local bending or damage of the equipment will not occur. Steel wrapper plates shall be used when necessary to distribute the load and protect the equipment.

- 2.12 Cylindrical equipment shall be mounted on shipping saddles. When possible, installation saddles on equipment should be used as shipping saddles.
- 2.13 Packing Categories

Main Piece(s) of Equipment Equipment Accessories Spare Parts Special Tools Tools and Spare Parts for One Year Operation

2.14 No release for shipment shall be given until written authorization to do so has been received from the Buyer.

#### 3.0 SHIPPING INSTRUCTIONS

A copy of these instructions must be included and shall also apply to each of your Purchase Orders directed to sub-suppliers making shipment directly to the jobsite.

- 3.1 Unless otherwise agreed, pre-pay all freight charges to jobsite and invoice at cost as a separate item. Charges must be supported by a copy of the Carrier's documentation.
- 3.2 C.O.D. shipments will not be accepted and will be returned to the Seller with all associated costs to the Seller's account.
- 3.3 As a minimum, the Buyer's Project name, Purchase Order number, item number, equipment and tag number(s) must appear on all equipment, crates, containers, shipping papers and packing lists
- 3.4 The packing list must be attached in a visible waterproof envelop and affixed to the outside of each container with one (1) copy attached to the bill of lading. Packing list must clearly identify each item, indicating quantity of items shipped and quantity of items being back ordered.
- 3.5 At least five (5) working days prior to readiness of shipment, provide (via fax or email), the following information to the Buyer:
  - Purchase Order Number
  - Item number
  - Quantity being shipped
  - Number, size, gross weight of packages
  - Method of transport
  - Special arrangements required for handling
  - Estimated time of arrival at destination.
- On Purchase Orders where Buyer's right to Quality Surveillance is exercised, no shipment shall be made without the Buyer's Quality Surveillance Inspector's "Release to Ship".
- 3.7 On the day of shipment, forward to the Buyer (by fax) as per instructions on Purchase Order, the following documents, with the original copies forwarded via courier:
  - Itemized Packing List and Weight List
  - Material Safety Data Sheets for Hazardous Goods (if applicable)

#### 4.0 LIFTING /HANDLING REQUIREMENTS

4.1 Packing shall be done in such a manner to enable cargo handling by forklift, cranes, slings, bogies, skids, or manual manipulation as size and weight permits. If site is remote, and if there is an absence of heavy lifting facilities at all points of transit, packing case size and weights shall be taken into consideration.

- 4.2 Should the Purchase Order equipment weigh two (2) or more than two (2) metric tons, the weight, center of gravity and hoisting position shall be marked with international trade transportation practice marks and illustrative marks on the two sides of each case so as to facilitate loading, unloading and handling.
- In accordance with the characteristics and different requirements in loading, unloading and shipping different Purchase Order equipment the package shall be conspicuously marked with "Handle with Care", "Right Side Up", "Keep Dry", etc. and with appropriate international trade practice marks and illustrative marks.

#### 5.0 SHIPPING IDENTIFICATION MARKS

- 5.1 Each case, box, crate, piece, etc. must be stenciled on two sides in clear, legible characters. On bundles the marks are to be "embossed on metal tags", which shall be wired securely to the bundle at the end and in the middle.
- 5.2 Indelible and ultraviolet resistant inks, paint and metal labels shall be used to preclude obliteration in any way of marks, shipping instructions and handling symbols.
- 5.3 Marks must be legible and shall not be less than thirty (30) mm in height.
- Only those marks provided on the Purchase Order, plus any cautionary markings and special handling symbols will appear. In no instance will advertising or marks which indicate contents or other extraneous information appear. Refer to illustration for an example of marks.

#### 6.0 EQUIPMENT TAGGING

- 6.1 Each item of equipment is to be furnished with either an aluminum or stainless steel name plate (as detailed in the RFQ), identified with the Purchase Order number, tag number and other data as required by the specifications and/or data sheets.
- 6.2 Any other tagged components (ie. Instruments, valves, etc) supplied with the equipment are to be furnished with a stainless steel tag, securely fastened and stamped with the Buyer's component tag number.

#### 7.0 VALVE TAGGING

7.1 All valves shall be furnished with a stainless steel tag, securely fastened and stamped with the Cenovus tag number.

Subject: Shipping Covers for Flanges, Pipe Ends, and Valves

#### Issue:

This Bulletin addresses the installation of protective covers on pipe flanges, pipe ends, and valves when shipped on a module or a ship loose load. Currently TR specifications call for plywood or steel covers with rubber gaskets to protect the flange faces during shipping. Of these, some specifications call for the covers to be bolted or just "fastened securely".

Recently, Nisku Mod Yard and Site received flange faces on piping spools protected with the duct tape which is against the TR specification requirements and also not acceptable. Removal of duct tape is time consuming due to its adhesive properties. In some cases, flange faces needed to be re-faced as duct tape doesn't provide adequate damage protection.


#### **Specification Requirements:**

Effective immediately, the specification requirements for the protection of pipe flanges, pipe ends, and valves during shipping shall be as follows:

#### Pipe Flanges:

- 1. Flange Cover Material: Plastic (preferable) or Wood acceptable
- 2. Cover Attachment: Plastic zip ties (Ty-Raps or equivalent) rated to -40°C
  - 2.1. For NPS 12 Flange and under: 4 Independent zip tie anchor points
  - 2.2. For NPS 14 and above:
    - i. Plastic cover 4 Independent zip tie anchor points (or more)
    - ii. Wood Cover 6 Independent zip tie anchor points
- 3. Tape and adhesives are not acceptable for cover attachments
- 4. No tape or adhesives are permitted directly on bare metal near flange or flange rim
- 5. Anti-corrosion agents shall not be applied on flange faces

#### Valves:

Small valves will continue to be bagged and secured with zip ties (Ty-Raps or equivalent). The excessive use of duct tape is NOT permitted to secure the bag in place. In any horizontal or hanging valve covered bags, the bag is required to have a hole to allow moisture to drain out/escape; this hole should be located at the lowest point of the bag. Large valves shall have their wheel handles banded to the valve body with at least two metal straps for shipping.

#### Plain Pipe Ends:

Plastic pipe caps must be used in all cases. If the cap fits loosely and must be secured, the use of one or two pieces of duct tape over the end may be used. Pipe ends larger than NPS 18 may be protected with plywood if plastic caps are not available; however, prior Cenovus approval is required. In this case, plywood shall be adequately secured to the pipe body.

#### Additional Notes:

ADM Piping: Mated ADM Piping Flanges (valve to flange) shall continue to be shrink-wrapped to ensure nuts and studs do not fall off during transport due to their low torque values. This is a safety issue.

#### **Affected Specifications:**

- 1. All TR/CVE specifications which specify shipping requirements relating to flange face, valve, and pipe end protection will be affected by this bulletin. Refer to Shop Fabrication of Piping Specification, TR-44-SPC-00-027-01 Rev. 2 Section 10.0, Shipping and Preparation, as an example.
- 2. All Purchase Orders specifying flange face protection in Transportation and Handling requirements will be superseded by this bulletin.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR RFIs, NCRs, AND COs

#### 1.0 Introduction

This procedure describes how the Vendor shall request information, resolve a non-conformance, and/or submit a Change Order (CO) to TSE once the Purchase Order (PO) is awarded and acknowledged by the Vendor. This process shall be used for all POs where manufacturing or fabrication is required. The Vendor shall keep track of all Requests for Information (RFIs), Non-conformance Reports (NCRs), and COs. Sample CO and CO Summary forms are available upon request. Any cost associated with providing these services shall be borne by the Vendor. Any cost additions or deductions to the PO, whether through the RFI or NCR process or for another reason, must be authorized by a CO (i.e., PO revision) prior to performing the work. Any exceptions or instructions otherwise shall be acknowledged in writing by the Buyer (i.e., TSE's client). The buyer will not be liable or responsible for any un-approved costs.

#### 2.0 Definitions

Request for Information	A "request to clarify or proceed", where a product may not meet PO technical
(RFI)	requirements or Specifications, or the requirements are ambiguous or conflicting;
	information is required.
Non-conformance Report	A "request to except" a non-conforming product with a proposed disposition (e.g.,
(NCR)	accept as-is, repair/rework, reject/scrap, replace, rework, or other); agreement is
	required.

#### 3.0 Request for Information (RFI)

The Vendor shall submit a RFI to the applicable TSE Project Coordinator or the specific email as defined by the Project Team using the form provided. The RFI should include a proposed resolution if applicable. TSE approval of an RFI is on a technical basis only. Any RFIs submitted without a proposed resolution, or with an unsuitable resolution, will be provided with an alternative resolution by TSE. If the RFI has a cost and/or delivery impact, then a CO shall accompany the RFI. The Vendor must obtain approval of the CO prior to performing the work. An RFI for non-conforming product will be returned with the request that it be submitted as an NCR.

#### 4.0 Non-Conformance Report (NCR)

The Vendor shall submit a NCR to <a href="NCR@threestreams.com">NCR@threestreams.com</a> using their quality program form. The NCR should include a proposed disposition, as well as identify the root cause and preventative measures to be taken. TSE approval of an NCR is on a technical basis only. Any NCRs submitted without a proposed disposition, or with an unsuitable disposition, will be provided with an alternative disposition by TSE. If the Vendor does not issue an NCR, a NCR may be issued by TSE. If the NCR has a cost and/or delivery impact, then a CO shall accompany the NCR. The Vendor must obtain approval of the CO prior to performing the work.

#### 5.0 Change Order (CO)

Only the Buyer's Project Engineer can approve cost and delivery changes by a CO. It is preferred that a CO includes more than one RFI or NCR if there are others. Any CO submitted with insufficient information will be returned for correction. Any work completed prior to the Buyer's approval of the CO may not be reimbursed. A CO will not be accepted if it is submitted after the work is completed. The Buyer will not be liable or responsible for any un-approved costs. The Buyer may approve the CO or advise that TSE provide the Vendor with an alternate resolution. If the Buyer rejects the CO, then further discussion may be required to establish a suitable resolution. If the Buyer approves the CO, the Vendor shall perform the work.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR RFIs, NCRs, AND COs

#### 6.0 Additional RFI Instructions - Only for Piperack or Equipment Modules

These additional RFI instructions may be applied to major capital projects where deemed necessary, due to the anticipated number of RFIs to be issued for piperacks or equipment modules.

When a Contractor, Fabricator, or Vendor (CFV) submits an RFI for piperack or equipment modules, these additional instructions shall be followed, to ensure that all RFIs are logged, distributed, and answered in a timely manner. Each RFI shall be sequentially numbered and submitted using the following subject line format:

Format	Sequential RFI Number – CFV Name – CFV Reference Number
Example	RFI #001 – Module Fabricators Inc. – MFI #2014-JOB-0066

All CFV RFIs shall begin with RFI #001 and be numbered sequentially for any construction work packages (CWPs) that they receive (e.g., CWP #C00.003.2.4.01A has RFI's #001 – #003 and then CWP #C00.003.2.4.02A starts at RFI #004).

RFIs shall only be made to email specified above and shall not be copied to any other personnel (e.g., buyer or TSE). Any further distribution shall be made by TSE.

The CFV shall prepare and maintain a RFI log and record all their RFIs. A sample log is available upon request. A copy of the CFV RFI log shall be provided to the TSE Expeditor upon request. The RFI log is shall contain the following information as a minimum:

- 1. RFI Number
- 2. Date of Request
- 3. Construction Work Package (CWP) Number
- 4. Description of Information requested
- 5. Forwarded to
- 6. Date of Response.

All responses will be answered by "replying to all" in order to include everyone in the original and following emails.
