- UT on Tank shell to be completed every 2' around the circumference, from 6" elevation to the top leg of the floor to shell weld.
- Add measurements and locations to CML Map.
- CML's must be scanned, and the minimum thickness is to be recorded
- If corrosion is found, technician must comment on the nature of the corrosion (e.g., localized corrosion, pitting, etc.)

This task list is not all inclusive and does not limit any additional inspection or examination or limit the areas to be examined. The inspector may use any additional reasonable means deemed necessary to determine the integrity of the tank for code compliance and suitability for continued service

External Inspection

All deficiencies are to be recorded and photographs taken All evidence of corrosion is to be mapped and depth measured with pit or depth gauge

Ladders, stairways and platforms

- 1) Handrails, inspect for pitting, holes and paint condition condition of attachment welds condition of mid rails and toe boards condition of safety drop bars for corrosion, operation, and length
- 2) Platform frame inspect for corrosion and paint failure corrosion and cracking of attachment welds reinforcing pads where supports are attached to the shell and roof thinning and holes in the deck plate or distortion of the grating seal welds on flat-surface to flat-surface junctures
- 3) Deck plate and grating, inspect for corrosion, holes and paint failure scale build-up on plate to frame weld thinning of bars and failure of welds on grating

All deficiencies to be noted. Unsafe conditions to be brought to the attention of Operations for immediate repair.

Unsafe items are not to be used during inspection.

Foundation and site



- 1) Foundation inspect for measure foundation levelness and bottom elevations. type of foundation cavities under foundation and vegetation against bottom of the tank. verify that runoff rainwater drains away from the tank settlement around perimeter of tank. areas where leaching of oil has left rock filler exposed
- 2) Site and dike inspect for condition of the dike drainage away from the tank and associated piping and manifolds operation of dike drains buildup of trash, vegetation, and other inflammables.

Shell and appurtenances

- 1) Shells inspect for paint failures, pitting, and corrosion corrosion and thinning at the bottom angle area where the floor and shell are attached dents, bulges or buckling
- 2) Manways and nozzles, inspect for cracks or signs of leakage on the weld joints at nozzles, manway, reinforcing plates shell dimpling around nozzles flange leaks around manways and nozzles, sealing of insulation around manway flange and nozzles. Inadequate manway flange and cover thickness on mixer manways
- 3) Tank piping manifolds, inspect for leak around valves, piping and flanges fire fighting system components anchored piping that could damage the tank shell or bottom connections during earth movements adequate thermal pressure relief of piping to the tank operation of regulators for tanks with purge gas systems leaks around sample connections damage and check accuracy of temperature indicators



If deficiencies are noted additional inspection of associated piping or support system is required to determine cause and recommended resolution

4) Autogauge system, inspect for leaks around the tape guide and lower sheave housing damage to autogauge head proper movement of the tape condition of the board and legibility of board type autogauges freedom of movement of the marker and float

All deficiencies to be noted and brought to the attention of Operations for immediate repair.

- 5) Shell mounted sample station inspect for function of valves and plugged lines including drain line and return to tank line leaks around circulation pump and operating problems damaged bracing or supports for sampling system and piping
- 6) Heater, inspect for presence of product in condensate drain line from steam type heater leaks around bolting flange for heater inlets
- 7) Overflow lines inspect for screens are clean corrosion no plugs in lines broken connections freeze damage
- 8) Shell insulation, inspect for cracks or leaks in the insulation weather coat wet insulation under the weather coat corrosion under insulation by removing sample areas

Roof and appurtenances

NOTE: For safety, before accessing the roof, check with an ultrasonic instrument near the edge of the roof for thinning. Verify the roof thickness is sufficient for safe support. (Corrosion normally attacks the deck plate at the edge of a fixed roof and at the rafters in the center of the roof first)



- 1) Deck plate inspect for, paint failure, pitting, holes and corrosion product on the roof deck
- 2) Deck drainage, inspect for indications of standing water
- 3) Roof insulation, inspect for cracks or leaks in the insulation weather coat wet insulation under the weather coat corrosion under insulation by removing sample areas
- 4) Sample hatch inspect for condition and functioning of the sample hatch cover condition of the seal inside of the hatch cover corrosion and plugging on thief and gauge hatch cover marked and tab stating hold off distance (where sample hatch is used to gauge product level condition of any internal lining of the sample hatch
- 5) Gaugewell inspect for thinning of the visible portion of the well, size of slots and cover condition hold off marker and tab for legibility condition of roof guide and rollers on gauge well for floating roofs distance from gauge well to tank shell at different levels if accessible
- 6) Pressure / Vacuum breakers, inspect for proper operation, size, number, and type
- All deficiencies to be noted and brought to the attention of Operations for immediate repair.

External NDE

- 1) Complete ultrasonic thickness survey in accordance with tank UT circuit drawing
- 2) Perform additional ultrasonic, liquid penetrant or magnetic particle inspection necessary to verify tank condition and integrity at identified areas of mechanical damage, blistering, cracks or corrosion.



Internal Inspection

All deficiencies are to be recorded and photographs taken All evidence of corrosion is to be mapped and depth measured with pit or depth gauge

General

- 1) Ensure tank has been high pressure washed or steamed to remove residual product to Class 3 cleanliness.
- 2) Shell inspect for banding and peaking of shell welds corrosion of the shell roundness and out of plumb corrosion at the critical zone of the floor to shell joint
- 3) Floor inspect for corrosion of floor underside voids under the bottom indications of leakage floor to shell edge settlement
- 4) Roof inspect for corrosion, holes and other deterioration broken welds in shell to roof joint
- 5) Internal heaters inspect for broken or damaged piping debris accumulation corrosion of components coating damage from overheating accelerated corrosion of the floor and shell in the area of the heater
- 6) Piping and sumps inspect for corrosion and coating condition pluggage holes distortion at shell to pipe connection

INTERNAL NDE

1) Perform ultrasonic thickness checks of internal nozzle projections, coils and permanent internals exhibiting corrosion and metal loss.



- 2) Perform additional NDE per vessel's last inspection report recommendations
- 3) Perform additional ultrasonic, liquid penetrant or magnetic particle inspection necessary to verify vessel condition and integrity at identified areas of mechanical damage, blistering, cracks or corrosion.

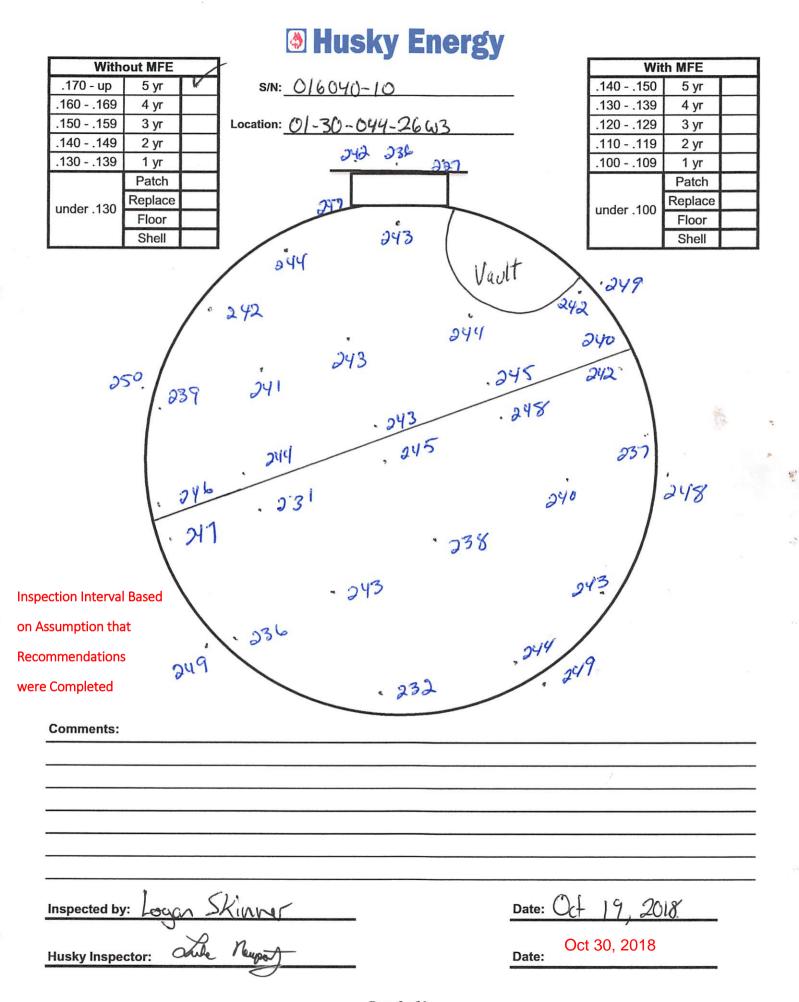
