Second Quarter Report 2023

#### Foreword

About a year and 6 months ago, the leaders of nine Quaker organizations and three non-Quakers set up the "Consortium", which brings together 12 organizations from the DR. Congo and Burundi with the mission of contributing to the reconstruction of the hearts and broken lives of the victims of armed conflict in the Great Lakes region of Africa by giving them the hope of becoming themselves, capable of working to take care of themselves away from armed conflict and violence.

#### Context

The persistence of humanitarian crises in the African Great Lakes Region has a negative impact on the lives of local populations. Millions of vulnerable children do not have support. There is persistent insecurity. There is an increase in cases of sexual violence against women and girls, population displacements which cause the persistence of food insecurity and poverty. Access to health care also remains a challenge, hence the need for humanitarian interventions in this region.

#### **Presentation of the Consortium**

The Consortium of the African Great Lakes Region is the union of 12 organizations (Congolese and Burundian) who work in solidarity to support the education of orphaned children, peace, refugees and the improvement of the socio-economic conditions of women and survivors of sexual violence.

Our goal is to provide support to the vulnerable (orphans, refugees, widows, women survivors of sexual violence, etc.), relieve victims of trauma through counseling and psychotherapy, make health care accessible, conflict resolution, promotion of peace and conflict reconciliation, advocating education for all regardless of social rank.

Our vision is to live in a peaceful and prosperous Africa

## Jobs done

During this second quarter, the consortium supported its teams in the field in its programs below.

#### Support for the Administration and activities of the Member Organizations of the consortium

The consortium supported the administrative activities of the member organizations to improve their internet connection and their activities in accordance with the Terms of Reference (ToR) of each organization.

## **Education:**



We have completed the education pilot project which started in June 2022 which supported 120 orphaned and vulnerable children in DR Congo and Burundi. It should be noted that these children benefited from school tools and school fees for the entire 2022-2023 school year.

The summary of school results of the education project:

It should be noted that after evaluating this project, we noted the relative challenges, in particular: insufficient school tools (uniform, notebooks, book, pen, shoes, briefcases), insufficient number of beneficiaries compared to the number of waiting. Challenges related to the lack of adaptation in the school environment: lack of tutors, malnutrition and disease. Finally, we will start the second year of this project in August 2023 and we ask for the support of each of us to meet these challenges.

## **Trauma Management**

We carried out the Sensitization on Gender Based Violence (GBV) in the village of Sebele / Fizi / DRC. 18 people participated in this activity.

We supervised the funds granted to women displaced by war in Baraka/DRC to improve their socio-economic conditions and supervised 10 girl mothers who were learning sewing in Bukavu/DRC.

We organized a workshop on trauma healing for 20 women and girl survivors of Gender Based Violence (GBV) in Randa , Bubanza commune, Bubanza province /Burundi.

We carried out a capacity building workshop on the protection of traumatized children in Lubumbashi/DRC. 30 people benefited from this training.

## **Peace and Conflict Resolution**

We conducted a training workshop for young leaders from different communities on civic education and good local governance in Uvira / DRC. 15 Young Leaders benefited from this training.

We organized a training workshop on active non-violence. 20 people benefited from the training in Bukavu/DRC.

We conducted an awareness workshop in Bibokoboko / Fizi / South Kivu for two rival communities (Babembe and Banyamulenge) on the role of music for peace. At the end of this workshop, the two parties decided to encourage their children to participate in music competitions for peace. 18 people benefited from this training.

## Food Safety

We proceeded to harvest maize, beans and groundnuts of the agricultural seed multiplication field in the plain of Ruzizi / Uvira / DRC and distributed the seeds to the beneficiaries of this project. 15 FO (Farmers' organization) groups of local farmers have benefited from seeds for the activities of the next season.

We raised chicks and marketed hens in the village of mwaro /Burundi

## **Health and Nutrition**

Raising awareness on passive screening for malnutrition and prenatal consultation in the high plateau of Bateke /DR. 27 people participated in this activity.

We carried out care of patients surviving with HIV/AIDS in Burundi.

We carried out a workshop on sensitizing young girls and boys on sexually transmitted infections in Uvira / DRC. 28 people participated in this activity. We raised awareness on the consumption of drinking water to prevent waterborne diseases in the province of Bubanza /Burundi.

#### **Training programs:**

We carried out the restitution of training on trauma management in Baraka, Bukavu and Lubumbashi / DRC. 46 people benefited from this training through our teams in the field.

## 1. Security situation in the Great African Lake region :

Some cases of resumption of combat between the M23 and the self-defense forces (the Wazalendo) have been reported in North Kivu.

In South Kivu, more than five fires during these three months. More than 1200 houses burnt down, more than 5000 people are victims of fire including children.

Over 600 dead, 5000 missing, and many life-threatened survivors in Kalehe flood.

The inter-ethnic conflict persists in the high plateau of Minebwe between bishambuke and banyamurenge in South Kivu in the DRC. In North Kivu, the M23 rebels illegally occupy certain spaces and continue to carry out offensives against the Congolese army.

## Challenges

- Insufficient funds to support all the activities of the twelve NGO members of the consortium,
- Difficulty supporting vulnerable children who are on the waiting list,
- Insufficient funds for our personal capacity.

## **Future perspective**

- Increase the number of vulnerable children in the education project
- Supervision of children who have difficulty adapting to the school level
- Strengthen school tools for the education of vulnerable children.
- Improve support for the twelve NGO members of the consortium
