What difference would it make for Friends to know about the wrongs done by our ancestors?

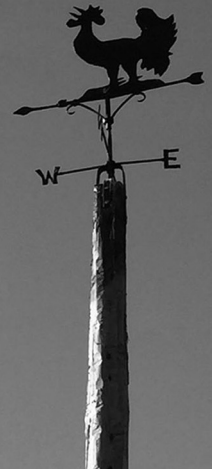

- End by asking everyone: Which ideas raised earlier were especially surprising or meaningful?
