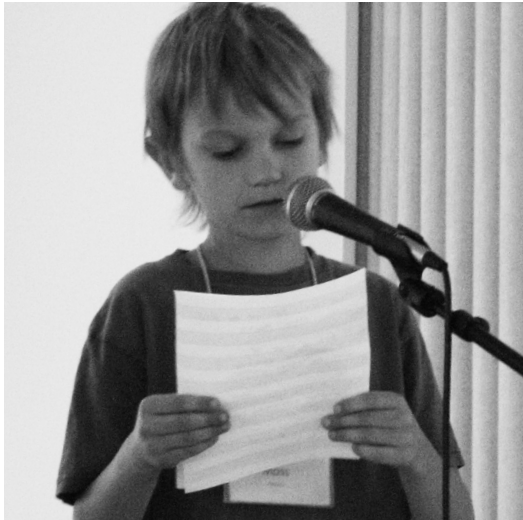


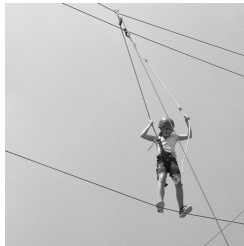
Intermountain Yearly Meeting
